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SHIELD HEALTHCARE ANNOUNCES ELIMINATION OF ADVANCED WOUND CARE PRODUCTS IN CALIFORNIA DUE TO MEDI-CAL CONTRACTS

Valencia, CA –The California Department of Health Services (CDHS) recently negotiated contracts with manufacturers to set a maximum acquisition cost (MAC) for alginate and collagen wound care products. The MAC contracts create a maximum amount that a manufacturer may charge a Medi-Cal provider purchasing the product. The negotiated rates will also reduce reimbursement rates to approximately 40% - 68%. The rates established by the contracts result in payment rate that falls 39% - 64% below Medicare. The manufacturer of the wound care products purchased by Shield Healthcare, Convatec, was unable to accept the contracted price required by Medi-Cal. As a result, Convatec alginate and collagen products will not be provided to Medi-Cal beneficiaries after July 1, 2007. The beneficiaries that are affected by the change have been mailed a letter explaining what has occurred. It should be noted that Medi-Cal did not establish contracts with any nationally known wound care product manufacturer. Shield Healthcare will not seek product replacement from any contracted manufacturer.
